

Through this experience of learning, reflecting, sharing and praying you may become a more spiritually aware human being. So, even if you are not sure about how God is leading you to use your skills, this program will help you become more deeply present to others in your life.

Our two-year, four semester program will begin on September 17, 2016 and continue on the following Saturdays from 10:00 am to 4:30 pm

The program includes the reading of current spiritual direction books and articles, leading prayer, listening to and interacting with guest speakers, practicing spiritual direction skills, doing an internship under the direction of an individual supervisor and peer supervision, presenting oral and written papers, and making a retreat. The program extends over a 2 year 4 semester training with practicum work during the interim summer.

Semester 3: God and Prayer

Semester 4: Different Spiritualities

Director- Nancy Nichols Kearns - As a retired high school math teacher and school administrator, I am thrilled to be living in Boston and enjoying the nexus of spiritual communities. I am married with 5 children from our blended family and 8 grandchildren. I have been a Spiritual Director at the Shrine for 7 years and a Coordinator of Contemplative Outreach of Boston as well as auditing courses and attending lectures at Boston College. Centering prayer sustains me and allows me to be grounded in active ministry. Wisdom Schools have deepened

this awakening. The Cursillo community, prison ministry at Framingham and 12 Step experience have encouraged me to feel blessed as God works through these encounters.

Clara Wood - I became deeply involved in leadership roles in the sacramental and communal life of St. Stephen Priory in Dover twenty years ago, initiating prayer groups and retreats and a two-year restoration and transformation of the Olmstead garden into a place of contemplation. Many years in spiritual direction and as a volunteer in a ministry for the homeless and as a hospital pastoral visitor shaped my interest in expressions of spirituality through nature and practices of poetry, storytelling and the arts which inspire my own spiritual life, and which I developed into an expressive arts program. I have been living in the Boston area for 38 years, a widow with two children and four grandchildren, my joy and delight.





Carol Mitchell. I trained as a spiritual director almost 25 years ago and it has been my great privilege and joy to accompany many people in spiritual direction since that time. I have been involved in the training of spiritual directors as well as working on preached, directed and 30 day retreats. My first career was as a clinical psychologist and in that capacity I periodically teach in a program in the California prison system to train long term prisoners to become addiction treatment counselors. I am married with three grown children and five grandchildren, two of whom live across the hall from us. I feel incredibly blessed to live in my favorite city doing work that lets me continually see new aspects of the face of God.

Dixie Burden I have a Masters in theology and another in Spiritual Direction from the Jesuit School of theology when it was in Cambridge, and the Center of Religious Development where I trained in spiritual direction for a year. In Newburyport, my home for over 25 years I lead weekly group Centering Prayer and provide spiritual direction for Immaculate Conception Collaborative. Both spiritual practices deepen my faith and move me to assent to God's presence and action in my life. I enjoy sharing Centering Prayer and The Twelve Steps with those in Sober Living. Service is an important aspect of my spiritual life. As a young nurse serving in the Jesuit Volunteer Corps in Nome, Alaska deeply impacted my life.
